1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
2. One course from the major must be chosen from the following courses: 337 (*Spring Odd Years*), 477 (*Fall Odd Years*) and 487 (*Fall Even Years*).
3. One course from the major must be chosen from the following courses: PS 346, 358, 368, 446, 455, 456.
4. Students will also take the following specific core requirements in preparation for the major: PS 111, MA 151, EB 211, and PL 260.
5. Students must complete 6 hours in the same language to fulfill the University’s foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible.
6. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
7. Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law related J-term courses (e.g., mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
8. Students may substitute another recommended Pre-Law upper-division course for this course.
9. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351, CO 370, CO 381, HS 368, HS 377, HS 466, PL 240, PL 260, SO 223, SO 292, SO 333, or SO 444. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites you opt to take.
