NOTES:

1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
2. PL 260 may be counted as the philosophy requirement in the core curriculum. PS 111 may be counted as one of the social science requirements in the core curriculum.
3. Students considering graduate study in political science should take MA 151 as their core curriculum mathematics requirement.
4. One course from the major must be chosen from the following courses: PS 346, 358, 385, 456, 495.
5. Students may take PS 466 American Constitutional History (*Fall Odd Years*) in place of PS 377.
6. Students must complete 6 hours in the same language to fulfill the University's foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible. Students considering graduate study in history are strongly encouraged to complete 12 hours of foreign language study in a modern language.
7. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
8. Students who intend to take the LSAT (Law School Admission Test) as part of an application to law school should take PL 240 Logic (*Fall Odd Years*).
