Dear International Student,

We have been diligently working for a safe return to campus for our students this fall. As you likely know, some parameters have been placed on how people who travel to the United States from international locations are to transition when arriving. To that end, Huntington University has worked to make this process as efficient and as respectful as possible. Below you will find the steps to this process you can expect, along with some additional items for you to be aware of. There is information for both commuter and residential students.

For Resident Students:

- When your travel plans to the U.S. are known, please let Dr. Brain Jaworski (bjaworski@huntington.edu) know when you intend to come to Huntington.
- A quarantine period will be required upon arrival. The quarantine site is at a safe off-campus location in Huntington. Transportation will be provided to you to this site. Meals will be provided to you during your stay. We have staff available to you and emergency phone numbers should you need them.
- During your quarantine stay, you are to remain isolated from the public and the HU campus.
- Meals will be brought to you at your location. You will receive more information on the meal ordering and delivery plan upon your arrival.
- If you arrive in the United States at least 14 days prior to the date you report to campus, no additional quarantine period will be required. In this scenario you will need to provide documentation of your arrival date to the United States.
- If you do not arrive in the United States at least 14 days prior to the date you report to campus, the following should be expected as part of HU's quarantine protocol:
 - A COVID-19 test will be administered on Monday, August 17. International student-athletes will be tested at this time even if their athletic team is tested earlier. If a student athlete has been in the United States at least 14 days, he/she will only be tested with his/her athletic team on August 13 or 14.
 - A negative test and an 8-day quarantine period from the time of arrival within the United States will end the required quarantine timeframe. The 8-day period allows for test results to be returned to the University and individual students.
 - A positive test will prompt an isolation period, which will end after at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared/positive test was administered, at least 24 hours with no fever without fever-reducing medication, and symptoms have improved.

- Once your quarantine period is over, you will be provided transportation back to campus and you may then move into your assigned residence hall room.

For Commuter Students:

- When your travel plans to the U.S. are known, please let Dr. Brain Jaworski (bjaworski@huntingon.edu) know when you intend to come to Huntington.
- A quarantine period will be required upon arrival. Since you live off-campus, you will be able to quarantine from your apartment or house. Please plan to arrive in the United States at least 14 days prior to coming to campus for classes or interaction with fellow students or university personnel. Also, you should not plan to go into the community and interact with the public during your period of isolation. You will need to provide documentation of your arrival date to the United States in this scenario.
- If you do not arrive in the United States at least 14 days prior to the date you report to campus, the following should be expected:
 - A COVID-19 test will be administered on Monday, August 17, or four days after you arrive. International student-athletes will be tested at this time even if their athletic team is tested earlier. If a student athlete has been in the United States at least 14 days, he/she will only be tested with his/her athletic team on August 13 or 14.
 - A negative test and an 8-day quarantine period from the time of arrival within the United States will end the required quarantine timeframe. The 8-day period allows for test results to be returned to the University and individual students.
 - A positive test will prompt a continued isolation period, which will end after at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared/positive test was administered, at least 24 hours with no fever without fever-reducing medication, and symptoms have improved.
- Once your quarantine period is over, you may come to campus.

If you have particular needs during your quarantine period, please feel free to reach out to individuals in the Student Life Office for assistance. You will also receive a cell phone number to call for assistance once you arrive.
