NOTES:

1. PY 111, SO 111, MA 151, BR 333TB, BI 241, and CH 141 meet specific core requirements.
2. PL 260 Ethics may be taken in place of PL 220 Introduction to Philosophy. However, PL 220 Introduction to Philosophy is recommended since students are required to take BR 333TB Theological Bioethics for their major.
3. A grade of "C" or higher is required in each of the following courses: EN121; CO 215; CH 141/L; PY 111 and 230; SO 111; MA 151; BI 232/L, 241/L and 242/L.
4. Students must be accepted into the nursing program before being granted clinical placement.
5. Nursing majors may repeat science and math courses once and remain eligible to enter the nursing program.
