**NOTES:**

1. Nine additional hours in philosophy are required. Sample courses are shown here, but other PL courses could be taken.
2. Additional philosophy courses or BR 331, 333CH, 333PT, 333TB, 341, 421; EN 441, 481; HS 322, 434; MA 205 are required to reach 36 hours in the major.
3. If you take PL 440 or PL 460 for the major, this will also fulfill your core upper level Bible requirement.
4. PS111 and SO111 are highly recommended for fulfillment of the core social science requirements. MA 151 is recommended for fulfilling the core mathematics requirement.
5. PL 333EP and PL333PL are offered on sufficient demand.
6. Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law related J-term courses (e.g., mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
7. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351, CO 370, CO 381, HS 368, HS 377, HS 466, SO 223, SO 292, SO 333, or SO 444. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites you opt to take.
8. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
